Dr Nick Cole

From a periodontal perspective – the tips and techniques we use to help you approach or meet our patient's expectation of cosmetic excellence.

My perception, the types of patients we treat is changing. The desire for aesthetic improvement is not an age-related request, more and more older people want to improve the appearance of their teeth. The difference however, old versus young, the starting point periodontally, either healthy tissues or some signs of wear and tear!



What can we do for them?

Learning Outcomes:

Developing a better appreciation of anatomic form and age related changes, both physiologic and pathologic, that influence our ability to provide cosmetic change and improved aesthetics.

Nicholas Cole graduated BDS from the University of Otago in 1981. After 3 years in practice in New Zealand he then went to London and completed a MSc in Periodontology graduating in 1986. Returning to New Zealand he then went into a group practice in Takapuna, where he maintained a general practice with a special interest in Periodontology.

In 1997, he left general practice and went back to the University of Otago to gain a MDS with distinction in Periodontology. Since 2000 he has been in specialist periodontal practice at 5 St Marks Road in Auckland.

He has lectured in New Zealand and Australia to various audiences and maintains an active interest in the provision of continuing education, also having been involved in the organization of many conferences and continuing education courses.

- He has been a member of the Auckland Dental Association since 1982 and was president in 2011
- For an 8-year period, up to 1996, he was a member of the Dental Advisory Committee in the University of Auckland, responsible for organizing continuing education courses.
- He served as Scientific convenor for the NZDA conference 2001.
- Co-Convenor for Australasian Osseointegration Society Meeting in Queenstown 2003.
- He is the current President of ANZAP having been on the council from 2012 to the present day.
- He has been a board member of the New Zealand Dental Research Foundation, since 2018

His implant experience spans 1991 to the present day, initially with a focus on restorative aspects then in 1995 doing his first surgical training. Since entering specialist practice in 2000 his clinical practice is now limited to surgical aspects of care. His 15 years in general practice however give him a broad vision of the periodontal and implant surgical / restorative interface.

Dental implant placement in the anterior region. Maximising aesthetics.

Implementing the 2017 Classification of Periodontal and Peri-implant Diseases in Clinical practice.

Dental implants are commonly used to replace teeth in the anterior dentition. No matter how well integrated an implant is, if the aesthetics do not meet the patient's expectations, the implant is in part a failure. The timing of



implant placement as well as materials and techniques used to maximise aesthetics will be discussed.

In November 2017 the proceedings of the World Workshop in Periodontology jointly held be the American Academy of Periodontology and the European federation of periodontology were published. This lecture will discuss the relevance of and the importance of the new classifications of periodontal disease and peri-implantitis and its relevance to everyday clinical dental practice.

Learning Outcomes:

Participants should have a good understanding of the importance of the timing of dental implant placement when trying to achieve good aesthetics. They should also understand the types of, and the use of materials and techniques to augment tissue around dental implants.

Understanding and implementing the 2017 Classification of Periodontal and Peri-implant Diseases into dental practice should help the practicing clinician better manage patients with these conditions.

Chris graduated with BDS from the University of Otago, New Zealand in 1979. After working in Christchurch hospital and in general dental practice in England he returned to Otago University and graduated MDS University of Otago (periodontology) with distinction 1984. He has worked in full time specialist private practice in Auckland in periodontics and surgical implant dentistry from 1985 until the current time.

Chris has been actively involved with a number of dental committees. Amongst these he has been:

Vice President of the NZ Dental Health Foundation 1988 – 1999, President of the Auckland Dental Association 1995 - 1996, President of the New Zealand Society of Periodontology 2000 – 2002,

Member of Board of the Division Periodontics, RACDS 2008-2012. President of the Australian and New Zealand Academy of Periodontists (ANZAP) 2010 – 2012. Chris was elected a Life member of ANZAP in 2018.

Chris has participated as a speaker in many courses and conferences in New Zealand and Australia. Several times Chris has been external examiner in periodontology for post graduate students at the University of Otago. He has also had some roles working with the Dental Council of NZ and the Australian Dental Council. From August 2020 Chris will be involved half a day a week teaching final year dental students at the Otago University Clinic in South Auckland.

Resilience through adversity and changing times - Finding the calm in the storm

In 2020, we have seen more uncertainty and change than ever before. How do we practise resilience, create momentum and keep grounded? In a world filled with an infinite amount of information, why is it that we know what to do, but we don't do what we know? Brooke Neal is a former New Zealand hockey player, recently retiring from the game after playing 176 games for the Black Sticks since her debut in 2014. She competed at the 2016 Olympic Games, and more recently, she won Gold at the Commonwealth Games in 2018, the first time in history this has been achieved.

Her journey has been far from smooth, filled with injuries, setbacks, grief and loss. Brooke shares her story with an open heart to inspire people to be their authentic self and to keep going through adversity.

Alongside an international hockey career, Brooke is a mindset coach and founded All About Balance in 2016. She has coached thousands of young female athletes to give them a greater sense of balance and hauora, in an environment that breeds perfectionism, anxiety, burnout and over achievers.

3:20pm AFTERNOON TEA (30mins)

Dr Clarence Tam

Minimally Invasive, Maximally Aesthetic V2.0

Our quest to mimic nature has driven technology to develop tools that not only hone our eye in both direct and indirect smile design, it has given us the ability to plan with the end in mind. This concept of Responsible Aesthetics allows three-dimensionally-guided, biomimetic dentistry to be performed by the modern cosmetic dentist. Cutting edge techniques ranging from resin infiltration, complex layering to prep substrate decontamination for maximal resin shear bond strengths in indirect cementation will be discussed.



Learning Outcomes:

- The attendee will develop critical aesthetic analytical skills in planning complex anterior restorative dentistry.
- The attendee will review a non-invasive protocol for treatment of white spots and incisor hypo mineralization, as well as the sequence for staging different treatment options.
- The attendee will review the use of GICs as bulk dentin replacements and how to maximise their benefits using a modified dentin preparation protocol.
- The attendee will learn how to use tints and effects to make their composite layered restorations pop.
- The attendee will review a cementation protocol that will eliminate contamination and reduced bond strengths by various homeostatic agents.

Dr. Clarence Tam is originally from Toronto, Canada, where she completed her Doctor of Dental Surgery and General Practice Residency in Paediatric Dentistry at the University of Western Ontario and the University of Toronto, respectively. Clarence's practice has a focus on restorative and cosmetic dentistry, and she strives to provide consistently exceptional care with each patient. She is well-published in both the local and international dental press, writing articles, reviewing submissions, and developing prototype products and techniques in clinical dentistry. She frequently and continually lectures internationally.

Clarence has multi-faceted dentistry experience that extends across multiple tiers of leadership. She is the immediate past Chairperson and Director of the New Zealand Academy of Cosmetic Dentistry. She is one of merely two dentists in Australasia who are Board-Certified Accredited Members of the American Academy of Cosmetic Dentistry (AACD). Moreover, Clarence maintains Fellowship status with the International Academy for DentoFacial Aesthetics. She sits on the Advisory Board for Dental Asia and is part of the Restorative Advisory Panel for Henry Schein Dental New Zealand. Aside from the professional organizations she belongs to, Clarence is a Key Opinion leader for an array of global dental companies, including Triodent, Coltene, Kuraray Noritake, Hu-Friedy, J Morita Corp, Henry Schein, Ivoclar Vivadent, Kerr, GC Australasia, SDI, and DentsplySirona. Moreover, she is the sole Voco Fellow in New Zealand and Australia.

Clarence participates in a number of charitable endeavours and takes great pride in achieving beautiful smiles for patients in and around her community. She sits on the board of Smiles for the Pacific, an educational trust and charity that aims to expand professional dentistry services across the entire South Pacific region.
